Dear Director Nuru:

Thank you for the opportunity to speak today. I am the HOA President of an 82 unit condominium building on Lansing Street, near the corner of 1st. and Harrison in the South Beach area.

I appreciate the hard work that the men and women of Recology perform on my behalf, yet I must object to the proposed rate increases. They are extremely front-loaded, and I believe are not in the best interest of the community.

I created my own spreadsheet to model the rate increases when I could not find a model online, even though they exist for 2015 and 2016 and seem very accurate. I have analyzed the results, and have discovered that the instant raising of the mandate increase from 10% to 25% causes the great majority of the 30% rate increase to my condominium building – from approx. \$3K to approx. \$4k.

I propose you consider a ramp up of the mandate increase, starting immediately with 15%, going to 18% in 2018, 20% in 2019, and 25% in 2020. I believe this accomplishes the goal of the mandate – to change behavior in the citizens of San Francisco. I don't believe the mandate was designed to impoverish the citizens and make it more difficult to afford to live in this city.

I would also suggest in the future that models of rate increases be available to the public at the start of the rate hearing process, or shortly after the start, to allow citizens an easier time of calculating their new rates.

I have attached my official letter of protest (mailed as requested via US Mail) and the spreadsheet I used to generate my proposal. I have also sent a copy of the letter and spreadsheet to my supervisor Jane Kim.

Dear Mr. Nuru:

I am against the Recology rate increases for 2017. I am the HOA president for 50 Lansing St., and I write this letter as an official protest against such an increase.

The new rates would cause an approximate 30% increase in our monthly rates. This is a staggering increase to us. This increase is primarily caused by the change in the mandated service recycling/compost level from 10% to 25%. I have attached a spreadsheet that outlines our increase and a proposal to phase in the mandate increase (at least for apartments) over 4 years. By starting at 15% and phasing it in over 4 years, the increases are manageable and gives us a chance to reduce our black bins and increase our blue/green bins.

We are a mixture of renters, part-time and full time residents. We currently have about a 50% recycling/compost mixture, but we will try to further educate our residents to do better, which I believe is the focus of the San Francisco Recycling and Composting Mandate.
